

Federal Government implements "Tough on **Drugs**" prioritising prevention.

Mortality down 67%



2007-2024

Federal Government scraps "Tough on Drugs" re-prioritising "Harm Reduction" over prevention.

Mortality sharply increased.

From 2007 to 2017 deaths increased:

- Opiates 260%
- Antiepileptics 340%
- Non-opioid Analgesics 210%
- (Alcohol) 270%
- Amphetamines 440%
- Antipsychotics 590%
- Cannabinoids 570%
- Cocaine 290%

Not only does pill testing cause an increase in use, but the majority of deaths are from causes which pill testing simply does not prevent.

of MDMA deaths are from taking pills with alcohol, cocaine, etc., which pill testing won't stop

of MDMA deaths were due to allergic-like reactions, which testing **cannot** detect

of MDMA-related deaths resulted from accidents post-intoxication, which drug testing cannot prevent

THE FACTS

Overdose within Sydney's injecting room are 63 times higher than otherwise recorded rates.

THEY WERE WRONG!

- No significant public health **improvements** observed in areas with injecting rooms.
- Drug-related emergency room visits did **not** decrease.
- Only a minority of injecting room clients engage with addiction treatment services.



Ambulance overdose callouts are

comparatively **higher** whilst the **Sydney** facility is open vs. closed



Available supply from local dealers markedly increased to cause multiplied overdoses

Overdose rate within Melbourne's MSIR facility was staggeringly higher than street rates
